DEPARTMENTAL ACTIVITIES

Dept. of Commerce and Management

All first-year B.Com. B.B.A., and B.C.A. students attended an orientation programme hosted by the Department of Commerce and Management. The department conducted four FDPs, three SDPs, and one national-level FDP in collaboration with the Research Cell. Faculty members have participated in and presented research papers at national and international conferences, seminars and also won the best paper award. Departmental teaching staff contributed to the university's service as members of BOS and BOE. The department collaborates with the Comment Forum to organise events to meet the industry's requirements and helps students acquire the necessary corporate skills. It has organised events like the industrial visit, the B-Quiz Master's seminar, the workshop on case study analysis, Talaash, a treasure hunt, power point presentations, budget analysis, exhibitions of GST, and other competitions for the students to familiarise them with the commerce subject and build their confidence.

Department of Language

The Department of English with Enjoy English Club had organised events like debate, pick and speak and collage making in association with the Amaze Cain, Rajarajeshwari Nagar. A walkathon was organised to raise awareness about the importance of maintaining a healthy environment. Λ Crack II with Page gession was conducted for first-year students' exam preparation. The Hindi Department had organised and celebrated "Vishwa Hindi Diwas" on 25 June 2022, as a mark of acknowledgement of Hindi as a national language. Dr. Balaji Naik, Faculty, Department of Hindi, Bangalore University, was the speaker for this event and be spoke about the importance of the Hindi Diwas celebration.

Dept. of Computer Science

The BCA Department has conducted various interclass activities through the Tech Savvy Forum. In addition to various competitions like togo-making and quiz competitions, Pick and Speak, etc. The Forum has organised a project orientation session for final-year and second-year BCA students. A National-Level faculty development programme on the topic "Identification of Fake Journals" was organised.

LIBRARY

Books worth Rs. 1.71,742/- comprising Reference Books, Text Books and Journals were added to the college library this year. The students are also provided with facilities to access the Internet to prepare themselves for various competitive examinations and events at the intercollegiate level. Besides, 13 National Journals and 4 international journals are available to the staff and students in the library. The library team proposes to extend their operating hours so that students can use the facility while they are away.

TRAINING AND PLACEMENT

With changing industry dynamics and rising industry imperatives, the role of the institution becomes even more important in creating awareness among students either as job-seekers or job-providers. In an era of shrinking global borders and expanding citizenship, SABS's efforts are focused on developing a broader perspective in students in order to better prepare them for their future careers. For the academic years 2021–2022, 192 students were placed. More than 80 students were selected or placed in Tier 1 companies. The package ranges from 2.5 lakhs to 6 lakhs. Placement cell hands-on training for students on "How to Crack Interviews".

SCHOLARSHIPS

With the vision of the government to make education accessible to all, the college enables the use of several schemes for financing their education. The management also provides concessions to meritorious and needy students to encourage them to complete their higher education. In addition, our college's Scholarship Committee has assisted students in applying for government programs. As a result, 47 students have received the SET scholarship worth Rs. SSP Shcolarship amounts totalling Rs. 21, 95,495 were distributed to 357 students.

NCC

The NCC devotedly trains the cadets to imbibe these values and be responsible citizens of the country. DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION:

The goal of the Department of Physical Education and Sports is to provide facilities related to physical education and sports, playing and fitness. The Department aims at total education through the physical, intellectual, emotional, and social development of people in order to promote healthier, happier and more successful people. The department encourages students to take part in sports, whether they are recreational or competitive. The department has produced many National and International players. College teams compete in intercollegiate and other major sports on all-Indian, interuniversity, national, and international levels. The department has organised intercollegiate-level sports activities.

EXAMINATION COMMITTEE

The Examination Committee, in collaboration with the Internal Quality Assurance Cell, oriented all the students about the pattern and importance of the internal assessment, seating arrangements, discipline, maximum marks, duration, paper pattern, and so on. Internal Tests and Pre-Final Exams for the Academic Year 2021-22 were successfully completed. The First Assessment Test for all courses (B.Com, B.B.A., and B.C.A.) was held on December 20th, 21st and 22nd, with a code of conduct that was followed. Failed students were monitored by a mentor, who suggested ways to improve their marks in the Bangalore University Semester Exam. The First Internal Test for the even semester was held from June 27th to June 29th, 2022. A retest was also conducted from July 30th to August 6th, 2022, for those students who were absent for I Internal. From August 23rd to September 5th, 2022, the committee conducted a Pre-Final Examination, with results displayed in the respective class room.

STUDY CENTRES: The College has Gandhian Study Centre, Vivekananda Study Centre, Ambedkar Study Centre and Basava Study Centre. Education is complete only if it enables the holistic development of the individual. In keeping with the vision of the institution to create socially responsible citizens, stressing the importance of values and Value Education.
