Girls taking oath On 15th February 2017, a session was organised to create awareness among the girls on D.A.R.E (DEFENSE AGAINST RAPE AND EVE-TEASING). Two ladies, Ms.Savitha and Ms.Revathi, from MSPL Limited, Hosapete conducted the session as a part of their CSR activity. The female students were given self-defence training with practical demonstrations. The workshop was a mixture of theoretical as well as practical session. It mainly aimed at training the girl students, identifying threat, building self-confidence, defending common attacks, training, techniques of escaping from strong grips, awareness about the stages of rape and defense, daily defence tactics which includes a slap, collar

grab, chest push, pull and push were also demonstrated.

Information of various laws, women helpline and safety apps for women were also shared with the students. Finally girls were asked to take oath stating that they are strong and can fight for safety.

#### **SCHOLARSHIP ZONE**

We at Seshadripuram Academy of Business Studies encourage students to avail the benefits of Scholarship through different departments. So that it can be additional support to their parents and also encourages the students to secure more percentage.





#### SET-SABS - Merit Scholarship:Rs. 2,50,000.

25 1<sup>st</sup> year students were eligible for SET merit scholarship. Each student was given a fee concession of Rs.10,000 against their PUC percentages being more than 85%.

#### **SET-SABS- Sports Fee Concession: Rs.70,000**

1<sup>st</sup> year students are eligible for this scholarship. Those who had played earlier in State and Nationals are given this scholarship.

#### **SC Prize Money – Rs. 1,40,000.**

Students who secure 1<sup>st</sup> class (above 60%) in 1<sup>st</sup> attempt in their PUC get this Prize Money. 7 such students had applied and have got the Prize Money.

#### SC (Vidya Siri and Fee Concession) – Rs. 188,548

Social Welfare has sanctioned Rs, 188,548 to 24 students based on their caste and merit.

#### OBC - PratibhaPuraskar - Rs. 65,000.

Backward class welfare department has sanction 13,000 to 5 students towards PrathibaPuraskar for securing above 90% in their Pre-University Examination.

#### **OBC** (Vidya Siri and Fee Concession) – Rs. 1,19,000.

**50** students were eligible for OBC Scholarship based on their caste and merit.
